RENEWAL CLASSES: Saturdays in JUNIPER 0802

Foster and Kinship Care Education (FKCE) classes provide quality education and support opportunities for caregivers of children and youth in out-of-home care enabling these providers to meet the educational, emotional, behavioral and developmental needs of the children in their care.

FKCE classes are open to all Resource Parents (foster parents, relative caregivers, non-relative family member) and anyone else who is interested in or who works with children care.

Resource Parents Include:

- People who care for non-relative children in outof-home care. Also, known as **Foster Parents**.
- People who care for their relative children, such as grandparents, uncles/aunts, older siblings.
 Also known as Relative Caregivers
- People who may not be related, but care for children of close friends of the family. Also known as Non-Relative Family Members.

Interested Parties may be teachers, day care providers, medical or emergency professionals, potential foster parents, child development majors, or anyone who is interested in foster children, children or care issues.

All classes are FREE

Classes qualify for B, W, D and/or F- Rate renewal hours

FKCE classes satisfy annual renewal hours for Los Angeles County Resource Parents (Foster Parents) that are licensed by the State of California. The rates and required hours are:

B-Rate (Basic Rate) 12 hours
F-Rate (Medically Fragile) 12 hours
W-Rate (Whole Family Foster Home 4 hours
D-Rate (Emotional/Behavior Issues) 18 hours
Participants will receive certificates at the end of each class

To receive a certificate for class hours in full, participants must arrive by the start of class. Students entering 15 minutes after class begins or leaving class before the end will not receive credit for attendance. Pre-registration is not required for renewal hour classes, however, pre-registration is required for pre-service classes.

Renewal classes meet on Saturdays on campus in the JUNIPER 0802 unless otherwise specified.

SHAKEN BABY SYNDROME

Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS) also known as (AHT) Abusive Head Trauma mostly affects children under the age of one. It is a criminal act that can cause brain damage, cerebral palsy, blindness, hearing loss, seizures, paralysis, and even death. Sometimes symptoms don't occur immediately, caregivers will learn that a child might seem normal, but over time will develop physical or medical conditions as a result of SBS.

Get Your Commercial Drone License and Start Making Money!

Aerial photography – Roofing checks – Real estate video – Weddings – GoPro stunts. Just think of all the money you could make if you flew commercially . . . and without spending the big bucks getting a "real" commercial pilot license. The FAA now allows you to apply for your commercial drone/UAS (Unmanned Aerial Vehicles) license, called a Remote Pilot Certificate, by passing a multiple-choice test and paying a small fee. No experience needed.

If you're flying your drone for fun in your back yard, you do not need a license. If you wish to make money taking pictures then you must have an FAA 14 CFR part 107 Remote Pilot Certificate.

This 8 hour Community Education course will help you prepare to take the Remote Pilot/FAA Test to receive certification. This course is classroom instruction only. There will not be any drone flying.

You must be at least 16 years old and have a valid government-issued picture ID. The test center fee is \$150 (FAA regulated and is not included in the price of the class). You will need to pass a TSA background check before receiving your license.





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
